REQUIREMENTS

- Have at least 4 full years of certificated teaching experience in Pre-k - 12 by Fall 2024.
- Provide demonstrated evidence of educator effectiveness (i.e. TEAM, LOE, TVAAS, etc)
- Meet requirements for admission to Lipscomb University M.Ed. or E.Ds. programs.
- Commit to working at the TFA Nashville-Chattanooga summer institute in 2024.
- Commit to pursue a full time leadership position within Davidson County for the 25-26 SY.
